## A NEW FOUNDATION FOR BCSD SCHOOLS

In 2021, the Foundation for Beacon Schools (FBS) was incorporated in the midst of the pandemic to harness additional community support for public education in Beacon.

FBS was designated a 501c3 tax-exempt nonprofit in late 2021. We are composed of a volunteer board of directors and an advisory board of school and community leaders. We have seven committees and working groups that guide and operate our programs.

# 2021-2022 School Year Snapshot







During our first year as a nonprofit, we were proud to post achievements in support of all our goals and commitments.

## **Building Community Support**

- Developed communications, IT and financial management systems and **grew our network** to 580 individuals in the first year of operations.
- Initiated relationships with a range of **local and regional businesses**. 25 businesses became **sponsors** of one or more events with monetary or in-kind donations.
- Appeared in BCSD communications, local **press and radio**, and email and social media campaigns.
- Partnered with a local philanthropic group and assisted in organizing the first Chicken
   Run 5K to benefit the Foundation.
- Partnered with the Beacon Historical Society, St. Andrew and St. Luke Church, and local film professionals on a **collaborative grant application** to the **City of Beacon**.
- Hosted our inaugural gala sponsored by thirteen local businesses and attended by more than 100 individuals, raising over \$4,500.

The Beacon Advocates for Music (BAM), a booster club for music education in the BCSD, became a part of the Foundation for Beacon Schools. The BAM team operates as one of our subject-specific committee to support BCSD music educators and students.


